



Orientation for the Bria Professional Administrator

If you are the system administrator deploying Bria Professional, read this orientation to determine which manuals to read.

You can deploy Bria Professional by manually configuring through a provisioning server or via the softphone GUI.

Deploying through Provisioning

Provisioning lets you:

- Remotely configure Bria Professional for each user: deploy a license key, configure the application for your network and for your supported services, and set up accounts for each user.
- Remotely deploy upgrades to the executable (if your service provider does not do this).

Provisioning involves an exchange between a remote server at your site and the individual Bria Professional installation. All communications are performed over HTTP or HTTPS, using POST or GET. The remote provisioning mechanism does not support redirect.

What to Read

- ❑ The *Bria Professional Administrator Guide* describes how to configure Bria Professional manually. Typically, configuring on a test computer is a useful first step in the deployment process.
- ❑ The *Bria Professional Provisioning Guide* describes how to set up a provisioning server and select the desired login scenario, and how to (optionally) set up an upgrade server.
- ❑ The *Bria Configuration Guide* gives an overview of the types of features that can be configured, and provides context for all the settings that you can provision.
- ❑ The *Bria Professional Configuration Settings* documentation is a reference document that lists all the settings that you can provision. It is a Microsoft® Excel® spreadsheet that you can sort as desired in order, for example, to view settings alphabetically by name, or alphabetically by topic.

Manually Configuring

If you do not want to implement a login/provisioning server, you can configure Bria Professional individually at each computer. Keep in mind that not requiring users to log in means that access to your service will not be protected.

Typically, you will install Bria Professional on a test computer and use the various configuration windows to configure Bria Professional.

When you are satisfied with the configuration, you can push the Bria Professional installation file to all employees and then either configure the application for each employee, or provide them with a list of settings so that they can configure it themselves.

What to Read

- ❑ The *Bria Professional Administrator Guide* describes how to configure Bria Professional manually, via the Account Settings window and the Preferences window. Manual configuration does not support login; you must make sure that each user's installation is configured for no login.

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
